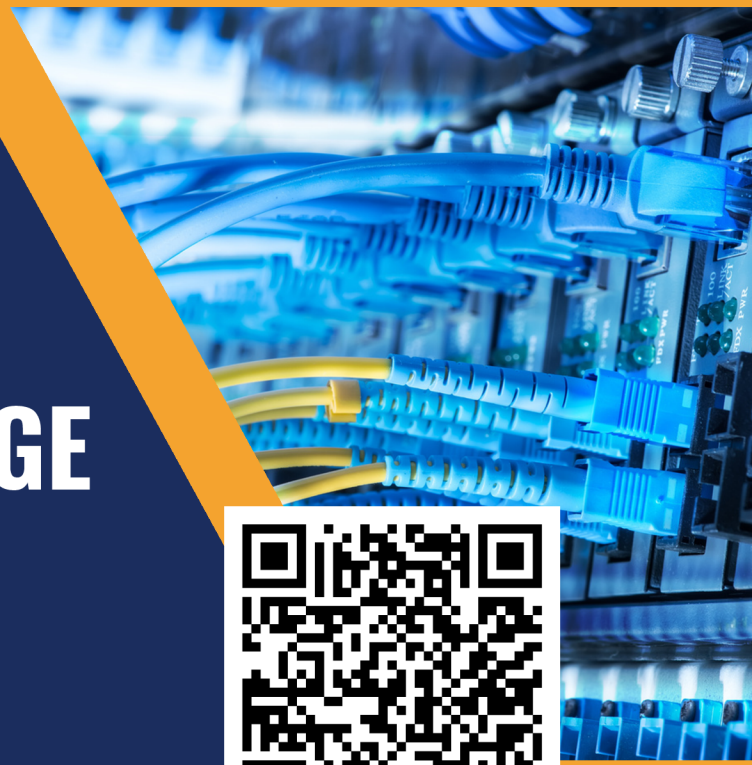

HOW MUCH CAN I EARN?

- \$18 - \$21 per hour to start. Apprentices generally receive their 1st raise in 3 to 6 months.
- Licensed LE Techs earn \$35 - \$45 / hour
- That's \$72,800 - \$93,600 / year on average

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- 18 Years Old, Diploma or GED, Algebra or Placement Test (see website for details)

WHERE IS SCHOOL?

- Apprentices do most of their learning on the job while earning a wage.
- Classroom instruction is conducted at Clackamas Community College in Wilsonville, Oregon.

Gather the Required Documentation

- **Diploma or GED:** Proof of a high school diploma, GED, or Associate Degree or higher from an accredited educational institution.
- **Algebra or Placement Test:** (one of the following)
 - Completion of one year of high school algebra, Integrated Math II, or equivalent with a grade of “C” or higher.
 - GED (2014 or newer) math score of 150 or higher.
 - Math placement test scores placing you into the second term of college algebra or higher
 - NCRC WorkKeys Applied Math score of 5 or higher.
- **National Career Readiness Certificate WorkKeys Assessment Scores**
 - Assessment tests can be scheduled through Clackamas Community College (Wilsonville campus) or Chemeketa Community College. Cost will range from \$40 - \$50.
- **Optional documentation** for additional points: Driver’s license, CPR Certification, DD-214, or registered Pre-Apprenticeship completion certificate.

Complete Application, Upload Documentation and Submit

Complete an Online Recorded Interview

- An interview link will be emailed to applicants upon verification of Steps 1 and 2.

Attend a Mandatory Orientation Meeting

- There will be a monthly mandatory orientation via Zoom. Applicants who have completed Steps 1 - 3 will be emailed a zoom link on the Friday prior to the meeting.

Scoring and Placement

- Applications will be scored after Steps 1-4 are completed. Scores are based on submitted documentation, WorkKeys assessment scores, and interview scores.
- Applicants are placed into hiring groups depending on their score. Opportunities will be provided to increase application scores if needed for better placement. Placement notification will be sent via email.

Program Registration

- Applicants will become registered apprentices after obtaining an employment offer from a registered training company and completing the registration paperwork. IEC Oregon staff are unable to estimate or guarantee program registration.
