

# Covid-19 Vaccine Information

## From Providence Medical Group Oregon

**Vaccines are not currently available at Providence clinics and we are not scheduling appointments.**

### **Here is more information for you:**

You may have heard that Governor Kate Brown and the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) have released the next phase of COVID-19 vaccinations. This includes:

- Phase 1B/Group 1, which includes childcare providers, early learning and K-12 educators, and education staff.
- Additional groups will be eligible by age in coming weeks.

### **Here's what our patients need to know to get their vaccination:**

- **Vaccines are being made available by phase.** When OHA releases additional vaccination phases and post information on our website, [coronavirus.providence.org/or-updates](https://coronavirus.providence.org/or-updates). For more information about the phases, [see this outline from OHA](#).
- **Once you are eligible, you can get scheduling information on the OHA's [COVID-19 vaccine website](#).**
  - You'll find the vaccine information tool by clicking on a round blue-and-white button in the lower right-hand corner.
  - Answer the questions to confirm that you are eligible. The tool then will direct you to information on how to schedule your vaccine appointment.
